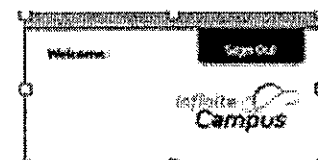

ELECTIVES

The following elective classes will be offered for the 2016-2017 school year. Some of the teachers may request that extra fees be donated to help defray the cost of some consumable materials or materials taken home. These materials provide benefits or experiences to the student above and beyond the regular curriculum.

ELECTIVES 2016-2017 (alphabetical order)

AIDE POSITIONS: Application required for all Aide Positions

Attendance Aide -NDAA*J Grades: 8

Students work in the office to assist teachers and office staff in various duties such as filing, delivering passes.

Media/ Library Aide-NDRA*J Grades: 8

Students work in the library to assist Library staff in various duties.

Office Aide-NDOA*J Grades: 8

Students work in the office to assist teachers and office staff in various duties such as filing, delivering passes and helping with planning of events.

Peer Support Aide NDRA*J Grades: 8

Students work in the classrooms to help support students that are differently abled. Student will assist students with teacher instructions in both Mrs. Teach's Core class as well as elective classes. Students in peer support aide in creating friendships and supporting social skills.

Teacher Aide-NDTA*J Grades 8

Students work in the classroom to assist teachers in various duties.

ART

Art 1: Cartooning and Illustration FAA1*J Grades: 7 & 8

Art 1 is an exploratory skills-based, visual art course that introduces students to a variety of media, skills and tools. Students will also learn about art history and the value of art in various cultures. Students will gain skills in understanding and valuing their own art and the art of others.

Art 2D: Drawing and Painting FAA2*J Grades: 7 & 8

This two-dimensional art class explores the Elements of Art and Principles of Design with a wide variety of media and tools. Artists and cultures will be incorporated as students experiment with their own creativity in different forms and styles. Assignments are based on the California Visual Arts Standards.

Art 3D: Drawing, Painting and Sculpture FAA3*J Grades: 7 & 8

This three-dimensional art class focuses on the application of the Elements of Art and the Principles of Design expressed in a wide variety of sculptural media. Students work with varied techniques to create original works of art, cultivating an appreciation for good design, craftsmanship and creative problem solving skills. This course is aligned with the California Visual Art Standards.

Advanced Art FAA4*J Grade: 8 *Prerequisite: Successful Completion of one year of Art*

Students demonstrate a mature understanding of the Elements of Art and the Principles of Design in a rigorous series of lessons. Students increasingly incorporate their own perspectives and style as they explore creative expression. Art history and culture and aesthetic valuing form a significant part of the course and a variety of 2D and 3D media will be introduced.

AVID NDAV*J Grade: 7 & 8

AVID is a year-long, college prep program that helps students who may not be reaching their potential improve their study/organizational skills as well as work on academic skills. Students will also get a chance to tour some local colleges and converse with guest speakers from the community about their careers. Students will be invited based on specific criteria set by the AVID curriculum, please see AVID.org for more information. **Application required.**

BAND

Guitar FAGT*J Grades 6, 7 & 8

Guitar is a year-long course for grades 6-8 where students learn the basics of guitar including open chords, note reading, tablature and barre chords. Students who consider themselves 'advanced' may also take the course and work individually to further enhance their current skills.

Orchestra FASI*J Grades 6, 7 & 8

Orchestra is a class for 6th – 8th grade students who play violin, viola, cello, bass or piano. We learn a variety of music ranging from classical to pop and perform concerts throughout the year, including field trips. Students of all experience levels come together to create memorable musical experiences.

Jazz Band FAJB*J Grades 7 & 8

Jazz Band is a before-school class for 7th and 8th graders who want to learn the art of jazz and improvisation. Students are required to be in one other band class but are able to take three electives. We give many school and community performances, and perform a wide array of music.

Cadet Band FABJ Grade 6**

Cadet Band is for 6th graders or students new to a band instrument. We spend a lot of time working on basic skills in order to advance one's ability to play harder music. In addition, we provide students the opportunity to play secondary instruments. We perform concerts throughout the year.

Concert Band FACB*J Grade 7

Concert Band is for all 7th graders who currently play an instrument. We play a variety of music that is fun, while still challenging us to become better musicians. We develop a stronger foundation of music theory and history, which allows us to understand our music on a deeper level.

Symphonic Band FASB*J Grades 8

Symphonic Band is our top-performing ensemble and is a training ground for the rigors of high school music. We purposely perform music considered difficult for a middle school musician, which makes our rehearsals challenging, but our performances very impressive!

Chorus FACJ Grades 6, 7 & 8**

Choir students will learn to use their voice to create beautiful music. Music of a wide variety of styles, cultures and time periods will be studied and performed including a cappella, classical, jazz, spirituals, and "pop"! Get ready for an awesome, fun-filled year of singing!

Computer Projects VACP1J Grades 7 & 8

This is a hands-on, project-based class in which students will be introduced to beginning programming that includes web design as well as application and game design. Students to learn how to design and build video games, create web pages, digital literacy, online safety and etiquette, computer hardware, keyboarding and graphic design.

Culinary-Foods A: Techniques and Methods VAFJ Grades 7 & 8**

This program is designed for students to acquire the basic knowledge and technique to prepare healthy, wholesome meals for a lifetime. Students begin basic stovetop techniques and develop into preparing complex menus, including a weekly Fabulous Friday Feast. A wide range of kitchen equipment will be used to develop these skills.

Drama NDDRMJ Grades 7 & 8

In Drama students collaborate to create complex characters, develop well-structured storylines, and improve acting techniques. The class focuses on character development, improvisation, script writing based on original ideas, and performance.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE -These two middle school courses (1A and 1B) together are equivalent to the first year of high school world language.

World Language 1A- (Spanish FLSAHJ or French FLFAHJ) Grade: 7

In this course Students will learn a World Language through reading, writing, speaking, listening, singing, playing games, performing skits, watching videos, doing projects, and experiencing cultural activities. Please be advised that this is an academic elective and students will have quizzes, exams, and daily homework

World Language 1B- (Spanish FLSBHJ or French FLFBHJ) Grade: 8

This course is the second of a two-year middle school program. World Language 1B is open to students with a B- or above in World Language 1A and/or teacher recommendation. In this course, students will build upon prior knowledge of the World Language and World Language culture using a communicative approach.

Leadership NDLJ Grades 7 & 8**

Students engage in school and community activities related to spirit and service. Students will enhance skills of leadership, teamwork, responsibility, public speaking, and accountability. Leadership is responsible for student body funds, dances, spirit days, and community service. **Application required.**

Media Graphic Design NDMP*J Grades 7 & 8

Students will use a variety of software to make graphics, animated images, sound, and video to create a digital gallery. This includes digital photography, videography, animation, digital drawing, web design and music creation. This is a hands-on, project-based class where students will learn create digital and print media such as songs, ringtones, t-shirt printables, greeting cards and printed photos.

Publications NDPUBJ (Yearbook) Grades 7 & 8

The focus of this course is the production of the school yearbook. The students are responsible for all aspects of the yearbook, including writing, photography, layouts, production, and distribution. Producing the yearbook involves careful planning, teamwork, writing and photography. **English grade of B or higher recommended.**

Robotics VAET*J Grades 7 & 8

Students will design, construct, test, and analyze a variety of physical models including bridges, mechanical arms, and solar cars. Students will also develop computer coding skills which they will integrate with their knowledge of physical systems to design Lego Mindstorms robots to perform a variety of challenging tasks.

Video Production VAVP*J Grades 7 & 8

Students will learn the basics of storytelling, camera work, & editing to produce a variety of original videos. This is a fun & fast paced class for students who are willing to work in a professional manner to produce various videos. Students need to be responsible, use initiative, teamwork, and creativity.

Video Production Advanced - VAPAAJ Grades 7 & 8

In this advanced class, students produce a weekly news & entertainment show. Students work in teams to plan, film, edit, and write scripts for the show. Students take on broadcasting jobs such as producer, director, teleprompt, technical director, anchors, sound engineer, and camera. **Application required.**
